

Week Fourteen

Fitzwimarc made it six out of six in the Ladies First Division to remain top of the table after a 5-1 win over Westcliff Seconds. Mandy Holland and Mair Dew both won three rubbers each with the latter not dropping a set. Barbara Childs and Holly Gillard got the one for Westcliff who have the opposite record to Fitz having lost all six this season.

Elsewhere in the division, Greensward kept pace with the leaders as they also won 5-1. Mandie Breed and Carly Horsler both won three rubbers each to help them triumph over SLH Rayleigh. Sarah Hall and Jan Watt won the one for Rayleigh as five of the six rubbers went to three sets.

There was nothing to separate Eastwood and East Thurrock in the Ladies Premier as they drew 3-3.
